Maintenance updates

On a regular basis, we maintain cloud connected features and functionality, such as Bank Feeds, Invoice Payment systems (such as Stripe, Paypal and Go Cardless), Opayo plus Salary and Supplier Payments (powered by Modulr). To maintain compatibility with Sage 200 we regularly test the integration and functionality of these features, to continuously deliver a seamless integration.

We are also addressing some changes to platform support and removing integrations that have near-zero value or where the same outcome can be achieved with an alternative feature. In this release, we are retiring the SharePoint integration capability from our product - not to be confused with the Microsoft 365 integration, which remains active - as well as retiring Microsoft SQL 2016 as a supported platform. We're also including SQL 2022 as a supported platform.
